Summary

Philippines' Magna Carta of Women (RA 9710, 2009) mandates $\geq 5\%$ of every government agency's budget for Gender and Development. In 2023, PHP 807.6 bn (23% of national budget) was tagged for GAD; all agencies file annual gender plans monitored by the Philippine Commission on Women.
