Summary

Since 2013, Grenada's Forestry Department and BirdsCaribbean have trapped mongoose, rats and cats at Mt. Hartman and Perseverance to protect the critically endangered Grenada Dove, whose population has stayed near 160-190 birds for decades despite funding-driven suspensions.
