Summary

Massachusetts' STEM Advisory Council, Technology Collaborative and Project Lead The Way launched a pilot of PLTW's semester-long AI curriculum in 30 school districts, training 45 educators to reach roughly 1,600 students from grade 8 upward in its first year.
