Summary

Between 2012 and 2024, Tunisia's ARRU rehabilitated 155 low-income 'quartiers populaires' nationwide — roads, water, sewage and community facilities for roughly 865,000 residents — via a 617-million-dinar programme co-financed by the EU, EIB and AFD.
