

QQI Pilots Microsoft Copilot to Review VET Standards While Providers Draft Curricula with ChatGPT

Summary

Ireland's qualifications regulator QQI has piloted Microsoft Copilot since 2024, in a closed environment, to compare standards and map learning-outcome gaps, while providers use ChatGPT for curriculum drafting — an OECD case study finds real but tightly scoped, supervised use.
