

Remotely from Georgia — A Free, Fast Pandemic-Era Registration for Digital Nomads

Summary

Georgia's fee-free digital-nomad registration drew 2,700+ remote workers in its first five months of 2020, but growth then plateaued and the scheme was later superseded by a standard year-long visa-free policy.
