Summary

India's Sakhi One Stop Centre scheme, funded via the Nirbhaya Fund since 2015, has grown to 733+ centres nationwide, assisting 668,139 women survivors by 2022 — but independent reporting finds under-spent budgets and weak police referrals limiting its reach.
