

Schweizer Accessibility-Studie — Two Decades of Independent Swiss Digital Accessibility Measurement

Summary

Switzerland sits outside the EU Web Accessibility Directive, so a disability foundation runs the country's only longitudinal independent accessibility measurement. Its 2023 wave found just 20% of tested Swiss apps accessible and more than 60% not sufficiently accessible.
