

Singapore's OneMillionTrees Movement — A Tracked, On-Schedule Urban-Forest Target for 2030

Summary

Singapore's national tree-planting programme, run by NParks under the Green Plan 2030, had planted over 832,000 of a targeted 1 million additional trees by January 2026, with publicly tracked progress and a projected 78,000-tonne CO2 sequestration gain.
