Founded in 2008, Sri Lanka's SLASSCOM chamber has helped grow the national IT-BPM sector from about 170 firms and 33,700 jobs in 2007 to 680+ companies and roughly 175,000 workers by 2025, per Sri Lanka's Export Development Board and industry reporting.
