

STRATCOM — Moldova's State Centre Tracks AI-Driven Disinformation Networks Ahead of Its Elections

Summary

Moldova's presidential STRATCOM centre monitors coordinated inauthentic online activity, exposing a 129-site, 50-language pro-Kremlin network reaching roughly 500,000 daily impressions via AI-generated content and deepfakes around the 2024–2025 elections.
