Summary

A EUR 110,000 EU4Moldova grant funded UNICEF and UNDP, with Moldova's Ministry of Education and ATIC, to train about 90–100 teachers across 12 competitively-selected schools in Cahul and Ungheni to embed generative-AI tools into student-centred STEAM teaching.
