

TATT's Persons with Disabilities Initiative — Subsidising Assistive-Feature Smartphones in Trinidad and Tobago

Summary

Trinidad and Tobago's telecom regulator subsidises up to TTD \$900 toward an assistive-feature smartphone for disabled residents. By late 2024, 1,239 people had received devices, against a baseline where only 57.3% of persons with disabilities owned a mobile phone.
