

The 16/6 Project — Port-au-Prince's Post-Earthquake Neighbourhood Return Programme

Summary

A joint UN–World Bank programme rebuilt housing across 16 Port-au-Prince neighbourhoods and closed 6 displacement camps after the 2010 earthquake, repairing 1,200+ homes and generating 15,000+ local working days, with 95% of jobs filled by residents.
