Summary

South Africa's Thuthuzela Care Centres (TCCs) co-locate police, medical, legal and psychosocial services for sexual-violence survivors. Since 2006, 66+ centres serve 44,000+ survivors annually, achieving conviction rates of 77–89% vs a 72.5% national average.
