

Toda City's AI Non-Attendance Risk Score — A Saitama Truancy Early-Warning Pilot With Built-In Human Safeguards

Summary

Toda City, Japan fused attendance, health and counselling data across 18 public schools into an AI model flagging ~1,193 of 12,000 students as truancy-risk. 90% of schools called it reliable; the city paired it with opt-outs and anti-discrimination rules.
