Summary

Since 2003 Toronto's TRIEC has matched 5,300+ skilled immigrants with professional mentors; a 2020 evaluation found participants 2.5x more likely to land good-quality jobs, with 85% in permanent full-time roles — now replicated in six cities and New Zealand.
