

Turkey's Law No. 6284 and the ALO 183 Hotline — Rising Protection Orders, Persistent Enforcement Gaps

Summary

Since 2012, Turkey's Law No. 6284 lets courts and police issue rapid protection and preventive orders for domestic-violence survivors, backed by the 24/7 ALO 183 hotline. Orders have surged, but femicide monitoring shows enforcement gaps persist over a decade on.
