

UB–KAUST–Partanna AI Micro-Course Sends Five Bahamian Students on Fully-Funded Saudi AI Scholarships

The University of The Bahamas ran a 10-day AI micro-course taught by KAUST faculty for Bahamian students in April-May 2024; the five top performers won fully-funded scholarships from Partanna and KAUST to study AI in Saudi Arabia that summer.
