

UNDP's AI Sprint — Liberia's First National AI Training Programme for Government Officials

Summary

In November 2025, UNDP and Intel trained about 70 Liberian government officials in a five-day 'AI Sprint' on AI regulation, everyday government use and ecosystem-building — the country's first structured public-sector AI capacity programme.
