Summary

Since the 2017 Rohingya influx, UNFPA has run Women-Friendly Spaces in Cox's Bazar's camps, growing from 19 sites in 2018 to 55 by 2025, reaching 330,000+ women and girls with health, GBV case-management and psychosocial support, though monsoon flooding repeatedly disrupts them.
