Summary

Since 2006, Lusaka's University Teaching Hospital has co-located medical, police, psychosocial and legal care for sexual-abuse survivors, lifting HIV post-exposure prophylaxis completion from 23% to 52% and becoming the model behind Zambia's 30-plus national centres.
