

# Utah's Doctronic Pilot — Testing AI-Driven Prescription Renewals Inside a State Regulatory Sandbox

## Summary

Utah's Office of AI Policy authorized health-tech startup Doctronic to let AI review and approve routine prescription renewals under a one-year regulatory sandbox, with physician sign-off, monthly safety reporting, and early data still under scrutiny.
