

Vietnam Pilots a Compulsory National AI-Literacy Curriculum Across Grades 1–12

Summary

Vietnam's Ministry of Education piloted a four-strand AI curriculum (human-centred thinking, ethics, technique, system design) in selected schools, grades 1–12, from December 2025–May 2026, after baseline surveys of 11,000 students and 35,000 teachers.
