Trinidad and Tobago runs 14 free ICT Access Centres and the WeLearnTT e-learning platform, enrolling 4,150+ learners since late 2023 and running digital-literacy camps for citizens aged 55–92, within a UNDP-backed national digital-inclusion strategy.
