

# Wi-Fi Brasil – National Satellite Internet Access for Underserved and Indigenous Communities

## Summary

Telebras operates 15,000+ satellite Wi-Fi hotspots in 3,000+ municipalities, giving 9+ million Brazilians in rural, indigenous and quilombola communities their first broadband access; a 2023 contract renewal targets 28,000 further satellite points over five years.
