

Yissum — Hebrew University's Technology Transfer Company

Summary

Founded in 1964, Yissum is one of the world's first university tech-transfer firms; it has spun off 80+ companies including Mobileye, and in 2018 alone signed 329 licences and helped found 74 startups — though it was bypassed on Mobileye's \$15.3bn Intel exit in 2017.
