Summary

Pontificia Universidad Javeriana co-designed Youth Collective Minds, a digital mental-health platform for Bogotá's youth, with 146 participants; a 2022-23 field trial of 435 users scored 85 on the System Usability Scale but only 18.8% returned after the first day.
