

Zero of Eight: Nigeria's Federal and State Government Websites Fail Every Baseline Accessibility Test

Summary

A May 2026 audit of eight major Nigerian government and university websites found none had basic accessibility features, building on a 2024 investigation that found 26 of 36 states non-compliant with national web guidelines and 14 sites unusable for people with disabilities.
