Established in 1988, Zhongguancun (ZGC) in Beijing's Haidian District is China's first and largest national science park. By 2024 it hosted 28,300 high-tech enterprises, 93 unicorn companies, and 2.7 million employees generating ~7.6 trillion yuan in revenue.
