Summary

Zambia's ZICTA used its Universal Access Services Fund to equip Chinsali Special School — 768 learners, 213 with disabilities — with 15 computers (5 running JAWS screen-reader software), a braille printer and internet access; a 2026 assessment reported improved pass rates.
